The Rector writes:-

Why are the churches still decorated after 12th night (Eve of Epiphany) I have been asked. It's not just a personal push-back on the fact that for most people the Christmas celebrations conclude with Christmas (whereas for the Church that period is Advent and our "celebration" of Christmas only begins on 25th December - or, in keeping with the biblical way of counting days, after sunset on the 24th. Although the Christmas season proper (Christmas to Epiphany) is a 12 day period of joy and festivity the *Common Worship* calendar also makes it clear that, following Christmas, there is a forty day period focusing on the incarnation that lasts until Candlemas on 2nd February (also known as The Presentation of Christ in the Temple or Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary). This 25th anniversary year of restoration of St Nicholas after the fire, we are organising two important choral events there to mark the end of the Christmas/ Epiphany season. This forty day period parallels the forty days after Easter that focuses on the resurrection. Just as we have the Easter 'decorations' up in church to remind us of this 'resurrection' season, so we have the Christmas ones up to help us focus on the 'incarnation' season. *Common Worship* stresses this by calling the Sundays we now celebrate "of Epiphany" rather than "after Epiphany" as the *BCP* has them. For the first three Sundays at least we are given readings about three great bible stories of the revelation of Christ's glory (the coming of the Magi, the Baptism of Christ and the Wedding at Cana). Perhaps it is a good time for us each to reflect on how we, individually and as a church family, intend to focus outwards to incarnate and reveal Christ in our community in the year ahead? *With season's blessings* *Anthony*

READINGS for the day.

Collect –

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit, that we may be faithful to our calling as your adopted children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 42 1 – 9

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his teaching. Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. I am the Lord, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols. See, the former things have come

to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

Psalm 29

SECOND READING

Acts 10. 34 - 43

A Reading the Acts of the Apostles.

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'



GOSPEL

Matthew 3. 13 – 17

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, ‘I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?’ But Jesus answered him, ‘Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness.’ Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, ‘This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.’

Post Communion Prayer –

Lord of all time and eternity, you opened the heavens and revealed yourself as Father in the baptism of Jesus your beloved Son: by the power of your Spirit complete the heavenly work of our rebirth through the waters of the new creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
