The Assistant Rector writes:-

Here what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all that truly turn to him ... So God loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son, to end that all that truly believe in Him should not perish but have everlasting life ... Christ came into the world to save sinners ... we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous and he is the propitiation for our sins.

These of course are words spoken just before we lift up our hearts to the Lord as we gather to celebrate Holy Communion when we use the BCP. They sum up this last phase of our Lenten pilgrimage, as today we begin Holy Week and the last leg of that journey. As we remember God's great saving act each week in the works of the Eucharistic liturgy they can become so familiar that we loose the sense of awe and true scale of what God has done, and continues to do for us. To try and re-capture a real sense of awe and that unfailing love of God I would urge you to join in with as much worship as you can this week. Be there as we remember that Jesus taught us to serve; be there as he is arrested and wait with him: feel that sense of loss on Good Friday and emptiness on Holy Saturday; then experience that wonderful feeling of joy as the light returns at the Easter vigil and really Celebrate Easter!

Collect:

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Liturgy of the Palms:

Matthew $2\overline{1.1} - \overline{11}$

A Reading from the Gospel according to Mathew.

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, "The Lord needs them." And he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, 'Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.' The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road. and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' When he entered

Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'

FIRST READING

Liturgy of the Passion:

Isaiah 50. 4 - 9a

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens—wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was rebellious. did I not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty? All of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up.

Psalm. 319 – 16

Response --

I will walk in the presence of the Lord for he has become my salvation.



SECOND READING

Philippians 2. 5 - 11

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
