The Rector writes:-

Christian Aid week begins today. This year the theme is “giving people a future without fear” and the money raised will go towards helping rebuild lives that have been torn apart by war. Christian love in action – seeking to be the Good Shepherd and protect the sheep from the “thief who comes only to steal and kill and destroy”. In our parish this Christian Aid Week will be bracketed by two visiting preachers (both at the 9.45 service at St Nicholas) from countries where our Christian brothers and sisters are daily facing persecution and discrimination because of their faith. Today we welcome the Most Revd Samuel Azariah, the Moderator of the Church of Pakistan and Bishop of Raiwind. Pakistan is suffering the ‘side effects’ of the war in Afghanistan and Christians there are particularly vulnerable to the abuse of swinging ‘blasphemy’ laws. Next Sunday we shall welcome Syrian Orthodox Metropolitan Matta Roham (provided his visa is processed in time!). His diocese, part of ancient Mesopotamia nowadays bordering Turkey and Iraq, has (had before the civil war?) the largest number of Syrian Orthodox faithful in the world. It played host to many Christians fleeing persecution in Iraq but now suffers in the current conflict. As is appropriate for Christian Aid week (the charity being the “ecumenical” development arm for many of the UK churches), both of our guests have strong ecumenical links, having served or serving on the Executive Committee of the World Council of Churches.

Please give as generously as you are able in the Christian Aid envelopes. *Anthony*

FIRST READING

Acts 2. 42 - 47

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

SECOND READING

1 Peter 2. 19 - 25

A Reading from the First letter from Peter.

For it is to your credit if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, where is the credit in that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. 'He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.' When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

GOSPEL

John 10. 1 – 10

A Reading from the Gospel according to John.

'Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.

The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they

do not know the voice of strangers.' Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

Post Communion

Merciful Father, you gave your Son Jesus Christ to be the good shepherd, and in his love for us to lay down his life and rise again: keep us always under his protection, and give us grace to follow in his steps ;through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
