Isaiah 55. 10 - 13 Psalm 65. 8 - 13 Romans 8. 1 - 11 Matthew 13. 1- 9. 18 - 23

The Assistant Rector writes:-

A few years ago it became popular to have something with the letters 'WWJD' on along with the revival of the sign of the Fish, rather than a cross. What was most interesting was that is had almost the same effect in today's terms as it had done centuries before. For the first 2 centuries Christians, as they had become know, were persecuted. It was a dangerous thing to be, a follower of Christ. The only safe way to find out if you were in the company of a fellow Christian would be to draw a fish in the sand. If the person with you understood this they might add an eye, if they didn't they would just think you were doodling and nothing more. When the sign of the fish returned people asked why? Why have 'they' suddenly starting to use something different - well we weren't we were returning to our roots, and it was a great mission tool to have this question posed so that it could be discussed. The same with WWJD. What does that mean? For all who wore it, it became a reminder that before making a decision you need to ask the question 'What would Jesus Do?' Just as our cross reminds us of the price paid for our freedom. Today as we ponder on what this means afresh, what it is to follow in Christ's foot steps and to carry His yolk - to be just like Him – perhaps what we need to do this week is to revive again WWJD, keep this simple mantra close by and reflect on this if Jesus were standing next to me now watching me and listening to me what would he think – would he be pleased with the decisions I'm making or disappointed ? Would he be pleased with my actions towards others or disappointed? Am I a good follower of Christ?

FIRST READING

Zechariah 9. 9 - 12

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Zechariah.

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! your king comes to triumphant and victorious is he. humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the warhorse from Jerusalem: and the battle-bow shall be cut off. and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.



Psalm. 145. 8 - 15

SECOND READING

Romans 7. 15 - 25a

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans.

I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.

So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

So then, with my mind I am a slave to the law of God, but with my flesh I am a slave to the law of sin.

GOSPEL

Matthew 11. 16 - 19, 25 - 30

A Reading from the Gospel according to Matthew.

'But to what will I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the market-places and calling to one another,

"We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not mourn."

For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, "He has a demon"; the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds."

At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'

Post Communion

O God, whose beauty is beyond our imagining and whose power we cannot comprehend: show us your glory as far as we can grasp it, and shield us from knowing more than we can bear until we may look upon you without fear; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.
