The Rector writes:-

Many people are fascinated by angels. A couple of years ago I attended the launch party for Angels - a delightful book by Jane Williams. In it she traces the story of angels in the Jewish and Christian traditions - showing how angels interact with humans at key moments in history. They not only comfort and encourage, but also help to move people forward in important ways at special moments. Although angels and their deeds populate the pages of Scripture we have few visual clues to confirm the images of glorious creatures that adorn our Christmas cards. Nevertheless, the idea is a powerful one and many people today believe they have seen angels - either heavenly beings or humans displaying angelic capabilities. In her book Jane explains that angels are all around us but they are only seen when they have a particular job to do. Do you ever wonder what, or who, an angel might be for you or how you might react to an encounter? Can we sometimes be the angel to another, bringing life-changing moments? Today's gospel reading invites such questions. Gabriel bursts into Mary's world and her life is changed forever. For most people the actual moment of such a breaking-in passes without bells ringing and it is only with hind-sight that we appreciate what was at work. Spiritual disciplines or practices such as the Ignatian examen in which we review the day in the presence of God can be a real help in allowing us to reflect regularly on God's place in our lives. In doing so, we improve our chances of not missing those precious moments of annunciation in our own lives. May God's richest blessings

be yours this Christmas.

READINGS for the day.

Collect:

God our redeemer, who prepared the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of your Son: grant that, as she looked for his coming as our saviour, so we may be ready to greet him when he comes again as our judge; who is alive and reigns with you, .in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

2 Samuel 7. 1 - 11, 16

Reading from the Second Book of Samuel.

Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you.' But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, 'Why have you not built me a house of cedar?' Now therefore thus you shall say servant David: mv Thus the Lord of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that

they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure for ever before me; your throne shall be established for ever.

SECOND READING

Romans 16. 25 - end

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans.

Now to God who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages but is now disclosed, and through the prophetic writings is made known to all the Gentiles, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith— to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory for ever! Amen.

GOSPEL

Luke 1. 26 - 38

A Reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will

name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, vour relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.' Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him. 'Who are you?' He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, 'I am not the Messiah.' And they asked him, 'What then? Are you Elijah?' He said, 'I am not.' 'Are you the prophet?' He answered, 'No.' Then they said to him, 'Who are vou? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say yourself?' He said, 'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, "Make straight the way of the Lord" 'as the prophet Isaiah said. Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, 'Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?' John answered them, 'I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me: I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.' This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.


Sunday January 18th 10.00 am. Parish Eucharist at St Barnabas for Fr James' first Sunday.
