Next week's Readings

Genesis 17. 1 - 7, 15 - 16 Psalm 22. 22 - 30 Romans 4. 13 - 25 Mark 8. 31 - 38

The Rector writes:-

I was horrified to read of the beheading of 21 Coptic Christians in Libya this week. It came on top of the chilling message of the Chaldean Archbishop of Irbil who I went to see in the House of Lords last week (and who later addressed our General Synod), reminding us that there were 1.4m Christians in Iraq in 1987 and now there are 350,000 and falling. Having had some experience in the region, part of my way of expressing support and solidarity is through being a Trustee (and Vice Chair) of the Christian development charity Embrace the Middle East. The charity has collaborated with Churches Together in Britain & Ireland to produce some Lent Course materials looking at Christian communities in different countries of the Middle East. At James's suggestion (not mine!) the CTBI resources have been adopted for our Ecumenical Lent Course this year (on Tuesday evenings at Crawley URC - do join us). As we begin our Lenten journey it is good to be reminded, as we are in today's gospel reading, that Jesus went into the desert for 40 days and nights to prepare himself for his public ministry through prayer and fasting. Our Diocese is doing something similar as it prepares for a renewed focus after Pentecost. You should have received today a prayer diary as an invitation to join your clergy (and many others across the Diocese!) in prayerful preparation for the launch of a diocesan strategy (or vision) that has emerged from the consultations over the past year. We can use the time to discern how this will affect our "public ministry" here in Worth. Pound Hill Maidenbower. Anthony.

Collect:

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ fasted forty days in the wilderness, and was tempted as we are, yet without sin: give us grace to discipline ourselves in obedience to your Spirit; and, as you know our weakness, so may we know your power to save; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Genesis 9. 8 - 17

A Reading from the Book of Genesis.

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting

covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' God said to Noah, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth'

SECOND READING

1 Peter 3. 18 - end

A Reading from the First Letter from Peter.

For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

GOSPEL

Mark 1. 9-15

A Reading from the Gospel according to Mark.

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

Post Communion

Almighty God, you see that we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves: keep us both outwardly in our bodies, and inwardly in our souls; that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
