The Curate writes

I do like Sue's choice of picture for the Gospel reading. I don't quite see in scripture 'And it shall be cut down by a chainsaw, strictly following health and safety guidelines.' Of course this parable can be read on several different metaphorical levels: the Fig Tree can be us as individuals or us as the Church. It doesn't look rotten and many ways it seems fine - but its fruits are rotten and plain bad. And the man who planted it (God) wants to cut it down, but there is the gardener (Jesus) who says let me have a go at transforming the fruit. There is a year reprieve (not long). So following the Crawley Review we are looking at the fruit we bear – what will produce better fruit? Fruit that means growth - in numbers, in our relationship with God and in vitality in our service to others. On May 7th Rev'd Simon Newham (Ifield) will be helping us to create a vision that will seek to see good fruit produced. My heartfelt plea is for as many of us to be involved in the weeks before (in prayer and conversations) and on the day in creating this vision for this is your Church and your vision of how to build God's Kingdom in this place – a Church that will exist long after the current clergy have gone - so please save the date and get involved by asking Anthony or me about it - Steve.

Isaiah 55.1-9

An Invitation to Abundant Life

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labour for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food.

Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David.

See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

New Testament reading

I Corinthians 10.1-13

Warnings from Israel's History

I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ. Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them, and they were struck down in the wilderness.

Now these things occurred as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not become idolaters as some of them did; as it is written, 'The people sat down to eat and drink, and they rose up to play.' We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single

day. We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did, and were destroyed by serpents. And do not complain as some of them did, and were destroyed by the destroyer. These things happened to them to serve as an example, and they were written down to instruct us, on whom the ends of the ages have come. So if you think you are standing, watch out that you do not fall. No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your

strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it.



The Gospel Reading Luke 13.1-9

Repent or Perish

At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, 'Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them-do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

The Parable of the Barren Fig Tree

Then he told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, "See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?" He replied, "Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig round it and put



manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down"
