When did you answer the call?

The calling of Peter, Andrew, James and John is significant for one simple reason. It is about obedience, unhesitating obedience. No questions asked. They simply left their nets, their work and in the case of lames and John, their father, and went off with lesus. It is often argued that the disciples must have met lesus or seen and heard him beforehand, but that is not what Matthew tells us. Their response was immediate. lesus called and off they went. This is echoed elsewhere in the Gospels- A man says "let me go and bury my father. Then I will follow you". Jesus says, "let the dead bury the dead and follow me". There is something about the call of lesus that demands absolute obedience. What about our calling? I doubt that our response to the call of lesus is as dramatic as that of the disciples. Many of us are cradle Christians. born into a Christian family and have belonged to the church all our lives. True, we may have strayed, had doubts and not been sure, but we stayed and went on in pilgrimage. Some may experienced a sudden conversion but not that many. For others the decision to follow Christ came as a result of the influence of a friend or a particular event such as a Baptism. We all have a vocation to call others in whatever way we can, often not knowing what the outcome might be. I remember a chorus we used to sing at a children's service many years ago -"Trust and obey for there is no other way to be happy in Jesus but to trust and OBEY"

I Corinthians 1.10-18

Divisions in the Church

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you should be in agreement and that there should be no divisions among you, but that you should be united in the same

mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, 'I belong to Paul', or 'I belong to Apollos', or 'I belong to Cephas', or 'I belong to Christ.' Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

Christ the Power and Wisdom of God

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Matthew 4 12-23

Jesus Begins His Ministry in Galilee

Now when Jesus* heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the lake, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: 'Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles— the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.' From that time lesus began to proclaim, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.'

lesus Calls the First Disciples

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter,

and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, lames son of Zebedee and his brother lohn, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him.

Jesus Ministers to Crowds of People lesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

Almighty Father, whose Son our Saviour Jesus Christ is the light of the world: may your people, illumined by your word and sacraments, shine with the radiance of his glory, that he may be known, worshipped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**
