It begins so optimistically, with Jesus' triumphant ride from the Mount of Olives, across the Kidron Valley and into lerusalem - and ends so tragically on Good Friday with the death of Jesus on the Cross of Calvary.

Consider the attitudes and moods of the main characters: lesus, knowing what was going to happen to him, remains calm on the outside - but understandably fearful and apprehensive on the 'inside'. ludas who was to betray Jesus, keen to make some money - but having done so realised the enormity of what he had done goes and hangs himself. The disciples, oblivious of what was going to happen to Jesus, enjoy a cosy Passover meal. Only when lesus is arrested do they take fright and hide.

Then there are the others: the religious leaders who are determined to have lesus put to death. Caiphas who is prepared to listen to false evidence; Pontius Pilate who is utterly confused but gives way under pressure to sign Jesus' death warrant. The crowds who, on Palm Sunday cheer Jesus on as King, now have turned against him.

As we keep this Holy Week think behind the Gospel texts and echo the words of St Thomas: "My lord and My God".

When they had come near lerusalem and reached Bethphage, the Mount of Olives. lesus sent two

and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, "The Lord needs them." And he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, 'Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.' The disciples went and did as lesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of followed him and that were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'

God's Servant Must Suffer

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens— wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious. I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard: I did not hide my insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me: therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame: he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me, who will declare me guilty? All of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up.


