I wonder which part of this morning's Gospel reading will stand out for you? Will it be the lavish generosity of the king? The apathy and ingratitude of the invited guests? The rage and judgement of the aggrieved monarch? The metaphors of the Wedding Banquet are not difficult to follow and they speak not only to the crowds gathered round Jesus but to us, his church today. If this morning's reading stopped at verse eight, or even verse nine, it might be rather dispiriting. We're often told the Kingdom of Heaven is a banquet to which we are all invited but now, Matthew is telling us: 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy.' Oh no! After all our efforts! We've worked so hard to get it right, to do the right thing, to earn our keep, to keep our place and now it seems it's all been for nought and the invitation has been withdrawn.

Verse ten is the one I like to remember. they 'gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.' The hall was filled with guests and, please note, with both the good and the bad. It's not just the irreproachable high achievers who get to go to the party; failures as well as successes are bidden. One saintly writer has observed, we are called to be holy before we are called to be good.

St Paul urges us to rejoice and not to worry. And he picks gentleness as the quality we should have and show for all the world to see; for it is to the gentle of spirit that places of honour are given. And like Isaiah before him, his message is this: Come to the banquet! Michael

Matthew 22.1-14

The Parable of the Wedding Banquet Once more lesus spoke to them in parables, saying: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves. maltreated them. and them. The king was enraged. He sent his



troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the

wedding banquet." Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

'But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was

speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'
