IS CHRISTIANITY THE ONLY WAY TO GOD? This is a good question to ask in a town like Crawley - a very mixed community with so many different cultures and religions. Hindus, Muslims, Buddhists are regular visitors to our house and we often have the opportunity and privilege to participate in their religious celebrations.

lesus said, "No-one comes to the Father but by me". Does this mean that those of other Faiths are beyond redemption? If so, it excludes tens of millions of fellow human beings all over the world.

There is the universal longing in humanity to know the answer to the big question "Why are we here? Who or what is the meaning of life and can we ever know the answer to our own existence?" In other words "Is there a God, a Power behind this extraordinary universe and our planet in particular?"

The search for truth and meaning is rather like a stained glass window. It lets light in as all windows do but some parts allow more light than others depending on the depth and intensity of colour. For us the Christian faith can be seen as the clearer glass. Other religions let in light of difference degrees of intensity, but the window needs to be seen as a whole. It follows that all religions have the same ultimate purpose – the search for truth and the meaning of reality as we experience it.

We can all learn from the faiths and the quest for truth of fellow humans. If you get the opportunity, find out more about other religions. As Jesus said, "Seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened". I cannot believe that God rejects genuine seekers of other faiths. Surely the Love of God embraces everyone.

# First Reading

Genesis 9.8-17

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the

ark. L establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy AND IT SHALL BE the earth.' God said. 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. 

# **Second Reading**

I Peter 3.18-end

For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to

death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a



proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you-not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, the resurrection through of lesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts;



and the angels waited on him.
