He illustrated this with a story of the friend banging on the door at an unsociable hour demanding provisions to keep the party going: 'because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.' The word for persistent can also, perhaps even better, be translated as shameless. Our petitions to God, Jesus says, should be bold, audacious, shameless.

Jesus is saying we can and should ask for anything we need and count on God saying yes and granting our requests. But what about when he doesn't, or his answer is not what we were hoping for? This can put honest believers into a bind between wondering whether God failed or we did. Most of us, believing it unfaithful to fault God, blame ourselves instead. We can't have had enough faith, or just didn't pray the right way.

The only answer is our belief in the God who meets us in the darkest, hardest, most painful moments of our lives, who in Jesus took on our life and our lot and died so that we might know there is nowhere we can go that Christ has not already gone, and that there is nothing we can do - or have done to us - that God cannot love and forgive, redeem and save.

Jesus teaches that God listens to our prayer, that there is nothing more important to God than being in relationship with us; we can count on God's attention, for he is the one who loves us with abandonment, loves us deeply, loves us boldly, audaciously, shamelessly.

John 15.9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one

has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command



you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.
