BIN THE SIN

Those of us following the Football World Cup in Russia will hear the word 'sin bin' quite a number of times in the next few weeks. But in religious terms what is the word 'sin' all about? I suppose it conjures up in our minds the things we should have done or not have done. The Bible, Church teaching and history is all about rule breaking and disobedience of God's commands. But it is all so negative. The phrase 'Thou shalt not' makes daily life so unattractive. We are told that God's nature is that of unconditional love, a concept that is incomprehensible to all of us because of the way we think and behave every day. I prefer to think that the fundamental truth that Christ died for our sins is not so much about breaking the rules as a lack of love. I think it was St. Augustine who said, 'Love God and do what you like!'

lesus spoke of loving God and our neighbours. So why not put sin in the bin and put the business of loving as a more positive alternative. That would make life so much more attractive.

Loving is not easy because of our innate self-centredness. But the more we think about it and struggle to be loving in all we think and do, the happier we shall be and consequently the happier it will make other people. So Love is the word that matters above all others.

So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord— for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So whether we are at home or away, we make it

our aim to please him. For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.

For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human

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point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

Gospel

Mark 4.26-34

He also said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.'



He also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all

the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.'

With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.

O God, whose beauty is beyond our imagining and whose power we cannot comprehend: show us your glory as far as we can grasp it, and shield us from knowing more than we can bear until we may look upon you without fear; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen**




