The two apostles we celebrate today are perhaps most noteworthy for their obscurity. Perhaps they should be patron saints of the anonymous and the unknown. Simon is called the 'Zealot' or the 'Canaanite', but that may be because he isn't the more famous Simon called Peter. lude is known as the brother of lames, but more especially as he is not Iscariot. Perhaps that is why lude became the saint of last resort, the one who would empathise with lost causes, hopeless cases, if his name was always being confused with that of the Traitor. Judas, not Iscariot, and Simon the Zealot, according to tradition, took the Gospel north into Persia and there they met their end; one clubbed to death the other sawn in two.

Of them we know little, their personalities, their triumphs, their failures. Were they intelligent? Were they persuasive? Did they stand out from the crowd? Their footsteps have left no trace in the sand and their deaths, though brutal, are but two among so many, yet it is the Gospel they carried that remains and is their memorial. The seeds of the knowledge of the Kingdom and Love of God which they planted in the hearts of the men and women they encountered on their journeys have borne fruit.

Though we may count ourselves as unknown and obscure, the Apostles teach us that each of us is chosen by God to be members of his household, citizens with the saints, built together, with Simon and Jude, into a dwelling place for and beloved of God.

First Reading

Isaiah 28.14-16

Therefore hear the word of the Lord, you scoffers who rule this people in Jerusalem. Because you have said, 'We have made a covenant with death, and with Sheol we have an agreement; when the overwhelming scourge passes through it will not come to us; for we have made lies our refuge, and in falsehood we have taken shelter'; therefore thus says the Lord God, See, I am laying in Zion a foundation stone, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone, a sure foundation: 'One who trusts will not panic.'

Your faithfulness endures to all generations; you have established the earth, and it stands fast.

Ethesians 2.19-22

So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God.

Gospel

John 15.17-27

If the world hates you, be aware that it hated me before it hated you. If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own. Because you

do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world—therefore the world hates you. Remember the word that I said to you, "Servants are not greater than their master." If they persecuted me, they will persecute you; if they kept my word, they will keep yours also. But they will do all these things to you on account of my name, because they do not know him who sent me. If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have sin; but now they have no excuse for their sin. Whoever hates me hates my Father also. If I had not done among them the works that no one else did, they would not have sin. But now they have seen and hated both me and my Father. It was to fulfil the word that is written in their law, "They hated me without a cause." When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning.

Lord God, the source of truth and love, keep us faithful to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, united in prayer and the breaking of bread, and one in joy and simplicity of heart, in Jesus Christ our Lord.


