John the Baptist is quite uncompromising in this account from Luke of his baptising and preaching. He looked forward to the imminent presence of Christ who would come with judgment and whom he, John, then baptised. For us, baptism is a symbolic act of cleansing, of washing clean our sinful tendencies and also a declaration of our life in Christ and in his Church. For Christ, however, his baptism was an act of identification with humanity and also a demonstration of the divine link with his Father who then sent the Holy Spirit to rest upon him. Baptism services can be quite baffling for families of children who, nonetheless, wish to have them baptised. What almost all those who offer themselves or their children for baptism do understand is the spiritual dimension of it. This is because very many people understand the significance of the spiritual, even if they have difficulty with religious observance and tradition.

Holy Spirit was given the physical form of a dove, a free-spirited bird of peace. God declared his love for his Son as an integral part of his own being. It is through our spiritual awareness and understanding that the deepest aspects of our life in and with Christ, our understanding of each other and of the world are most fully realised. We come to church in order to have that awareness and understanding nourished so that we can grow more fully as spiritual beings in Christ as well as citizens and servants of God's Kingdom.

At Christ's baptism, the presence of the

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit, that we may be faithful to our calling as your adopted children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Reading Isaiah 43.1-7

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O lacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour, I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you: I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you: I will say to the north, 'Give them up', and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Psalm Psalm 29

Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.
Ascribe to the Lord the glory of his name; worship the Lord in holy splendour.
The voice of the Lord is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord, over mighty



waters. The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty. The voice of the Lord breaks the

cedars; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon. He makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox.

Reading Acts 8.14-17

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Luke 3.15-17, 21-22

As the people were filled with expectation,

and all were
questioning in their
hearts concerning
John, whether he
might be the Messiah,
John answered all of
them by saying, 'I
baptize you with
water; but one who is
more powerful than I



is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

Post Communion

Lord of all time and eternity, you opened the heavens and revealed yourself as Father in the baptism of lesus your beloved Son: by the power of your Spirit complete the heavenly work of our rebirth through the waters of the new creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**


