What can we learn from these two great saints: Peter and Paul?

There is so much that these two men did to establish and build the Church, teaching and modelling what they had learned from Jesus himself.

In our gospel reading Jesus calls Peter the rock on which he will build the church.

Peter trusted in Jesus. Peter's trust in Jesus enabled him to walk on the waves. Peter believed in him. He was first to call Jesus the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Peter taught others about Jesus. His trust and belief in Jesus propelled him into action and enabled him to tell thousands who Jesus was.

Paul also believed and trusted in Jesus and worked tirelessly all his life to spread the gospel despite initial mistrust, hardships and imprisonments.

Both men were not faultless. Peter had denied Jesus three times. Paul as Saul had persecuted the Church. Yet this did not hold them back. They remained true to Jesus and taught others what they had learned from him.

As we enter the 'green season' in the church calendar, ordinary time, we have an opportunity to reflect upon our understanding of Christian teaching. This can be a time for renewal and growth; time to check we are on a firm footing in our faith.

Let's check our 'foundations' so that by believing and trusting we can be propelled into action, living a life with lesus - whatever that may look like!



# Reading Acts 12.1-11

About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased the lews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. (This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread.) When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him. The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of



the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his wrists. The angel

said to him, 'Fasten your belt and put on your sandals.' He did so. Then he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak around you and follow me.' Peter went out and followed him; he did not realize that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I am sure that the

Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.'

#### Psalm Psalm 125

Those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zion, which cannot be moved, but abides for ever. As the mountains surround Jerusalem, so the Lord surrounds his people, from this time on and for evermore. For the sceptre of wickedness shall not rest on the land allotted to the righteous, so that the righteous may not stretch out their hands to do wrong. Do good, O Lord, to those who are good, and to those who are upright in their hearts. But those who turn aside to their own crooked ways the Lord will lead away with evildoers. Peace be upon Israel!

## **Reading** 2 Timothy 4.6-8,17-18

As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have

finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the



righteous judge, will give to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

# Gospel Matthew 16.13-19

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living

God.' And Jesus answered him, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates

of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will



be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.'
