Advent is a time when many ideas run concurrently. The expectation of the celebration of the birth of Jesus, the coming of the long awaited Saviour foretold by ancient prophecies and the expectation of the second coming of Christ, our King and our Judge, who will bring to fulfilment God's plan for all peoples and worlds. The cosmic and the particular. the historic and transcendent, where an unremarkable story of a young mother and her infant meets something so profound, mysterious and awesome; echoing down the ages, changing our perceptions of love, of truth, justice and mercy. The story of Jesus could be described as someone 'whose mother was unmarried, a political refugee, mother of a condemned criminal, a widow who outlived her child, a model for our time, to whom the will of God meant more than the rules of any system, sacred or secular, values she passed on to her son who was condemned because of them.' However, the story of Jesus the condemned criminal, the one-time local preacher who built up a reasonable following in an out of the way province of the Roman empire would have long since died out had it not been for one simple thing: God raised him from the dead and gave him glory. So it is in Advent, we look for the Kingdom to come, while finding the King already in our midst.

'O come, O come, Emmanuel, God-withus here and now to dwell, at one with our humanity, in whom we find our destiny.'

Collect

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Reading Isaiah 2.1-5

In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate



for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

Psalm Psalm 122

I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!' Our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem.

Jerusalem - built as a city that is bound firmly together. To it the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, as was decreed for Israel, to give thanks to the name of the Lord. For there the

Reading Romans 13.11-14
Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became



believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Gospel Matthew 24.36-44

'But about that day and hour no one knows,



neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

O Lord our God, make us watchful and keep us faithful as we await the coming of your Son our Lord; that, when he shall appear, he may not find us sleeping in sin but active in his service and joyful in his praise; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**


