The first miracle?

Jesus seems reluctant to intervene in this situation where the wine is running out at this wedding in Cana. For the wine to run out at a wedding would have been quite disgraceful and some would have thought did not bode well for the future of the newly married couple.

It intrigues me as to what Jesus may have miraculously done before that imbued his mother with such confidence in him.

Surely throughout his childhood and life up till then, there had been signs that Mary had witnessed, which now prompted her to 'encourage' him.

Fascinating.

We all have situations in our lives which catch us out, perhaps make us feel ashamed, anxious or panic. Perhaps in those moments we have all forgotten the advice of Mary the mother of Jesus and 'Do whatever he tells you'. This scripture is providing us with some much-needed revision!

Jesus can take and transform whatever we give him. He can and does give us strength to go forward and carry on, in these days, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

For me, he has spoken words of comfort that felt like balm when I have been stricken with grief, through one who is yet to believe. He has strengthened me through people of faith in word and deed, through dreams and signs, through prayer, scripture, word and song.

Let us resolve to hand our troubles to Jesus; he can transform the situation.

After his return from the defeat of Chedorlaomer and the kings who were with him, the king of Sodom went out to meet him at the Valley of Shaveh (that is, the King's



Reading Revelation 19.6-10

Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many

waters and like the sound of mighty thunder-peals, crying out, 'Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready; to her it has been granted to be clothed with fine linen, bright and pure' - for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints.

And the angel said to me, 'Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.' And he said to me,

'These are true words of God.' Then I fell down at his feet to worship him, but he



said to me, 'You must not do that! I am a fellow-servant with you and your comrades who hold the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.'

Gospel John 2.1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother

said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells

you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them.



'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the

guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Almighty Father, whose Son our Saviour Jesus Christ is the light of the world: may your people, illumined by your word and sacraments, shine with the radiance of his glory, that he may be known, worshipped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever.



Due to current guidelines the Hangout Youth Club is suspended until further notice.


