Mothering Sunday

Please send pew sheet notices to pewsheet@worthparish.org or phone 0300 111 8150 Luke tells us in today's gospel reading that it was Christ's mother, Mary, who was informed in the Temple by Simeon of Christ's future impact on Israel and also on her at Christ's crucifixion. We know from this account that both of Christ's parents were present but it seems to have been his mother, Mary, whom Simeon addressed.

Today is Mothering Sunday on which mothers are honoured and on which, historically, individuals visited their 'mother church', the church in which they were baptised. It is also sub-titled as 'Refreshment (Laetare) Sunday', a day of respite from the fasting of the Lenten period.

One of the last acts of Christ on the Cross was to ensure the safekeeping of his mother and so he asked John, as described in St John's gospel, to assume responsibility for her. Mary had thought very deeply about her particular responsibilities as the mother of Christ and her role as the 'Mother of God' is widely revered within the Church, especially within particular denominations of it. Motherhood is fundamental to the continuation and wellbeing of human society although we must on this day also remember all those for whom - and for various reasons - the opportunities of motherhood are denied.

One of the very great significances of the references to Mary in the gospels is an underpinning of the importance of women in the life of Christ, his encounters with them, their care and concern for him and their receipt, before any man, of the glorious news of Christ's resurrection. Globally, we have just honoured all women in International Women's Day. To what extent should we consider today that this honouring is still a work in progress?

Reading | Samuel 1.20-28

In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, 'I have asked him of the Lord.'

The man Elkanah and all his household went up to offer to the Lord the yearly sacrifice, and to pay his vow. But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, 'As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him, that he may appear in the presence of the Lord, and remain there for ever: I will offer him as a nazirite for all time.' Her husband Elkanah said to her, 'Do what seems best to you, wait until you have weaned him; only - may the Lord establish his word.' So the woman remained and nursed her son, until she weaned him. When she had weaned him, she took him up with her, along with a threeyear-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine. She brought him to the house of the Lord at Shiloh; and the child was young. Then



they slaughtered the bull, and they brought the child to Eli. And she said, 'Oh, my lord! As you live, my lord, I am the woman who was standing here in your presence, praying to the Lord. For this child I prayed; and the Lord has

granted me the petition that I made to him. Therefore I have lent him to the Lord; as long as he lives, he is given to the Lord.'
She left him there for the Lord.

Psalm Psalm 127

Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labour in vain. Unless the Lord guards the city, the guard keeps watch in vain. It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for he gives sleep to his beloved.

Sons are indeed a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior



are the sons of one's youth. Happy is the man who has his quiver full of them. He shall not be put to shame when he speaks with his enemies in the gate.

Reading Colossians 3.12-17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved,



clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility,

meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Gospel Luke 2.33-35

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner



thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

Loving God, as a mother feeds her children at the breast you feed us in this sacrament with the food and drink of eternal life: help us who have tasted your goodness to grow in grace within the household of faith; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
