Please stand as the Altar Party enters the Church, then kneel or sit while the clergy prostrate themselves before the Altar. Please stand when the clergy stand.

# Gospel of the Burial of Christ John 19. 38–42

After these things, Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, though a secret one because of his fear of the Jews, asked Pilate to let him take away the body of Jesus. Pilate gave him permission; so he came and removed his body. Nicodemus, who had at first come to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, weighing about a hundred pounds. They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, according to the burial custom of the Jews. Now there was a garden in the place where he was crucified, and in the garden there was a new tomb in which no one had ever been laid. And so, because it was the Jewish day of Preparation, and the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

### **EASTER VIGIL**

Everyone is invited to speak or sing the words in **bold**. The hymns may be on a separate sheet or the hymn numbers will be on the board in the front of the church. We gather outside the church for The Service of Light.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer.

This is the Passover of the Lord.

We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries, confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

The new fire is kindled.

Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light: set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. **Amen.** 

Incense studs are inserted into the Paschal Candle. By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. **Amen.**  The Paschal Candle is lit.

May the light of Christ, rising in glory,
banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

As the Paschal Candle is carried in, three times we sing The Light of Christ.

Thanks be to God.

During the procession, the people's candles are lit. When the Paschal Candle is placed in position, the ancient hymn of praise, Exsultet, is sung. At the end, please sit and extinguish your candle.
