

The Old Testament reading provides us with a startling story of ingenuity by a mother and daughter to secure the protection of a baby son who was in mortal danger. This was a carefully executed plan to be sure, which took enormous courage and bravado. This act enabled Moses to grow up safely and to be pivotal in the freedom of the Israelites many years later. His life was protected, and he was able to fulfil his potential.

For children to grow and flourish they need physical safety but also emotional and psychological safety to reach their goals, hopefully realise their dreams and live a fulfilling life. That is what I imagine most parents want and hope for their children.

Paul's letter to the Colossians maybe provides us with a 'parenting blueprint'. Why not 'put on' compassion, kindness, humility, meekness (gentleness) and patience and above all love in relation to our children and not just for each other? Remember to teach and admonish with wisdom, that sounds good, what else do we need? How about the need for truthfulness, the spirit of forgiveness and mutual tolerance?

I am not sure whether Paul was a parent or not but when he was writing to the Colossians, he has inadvertently given us some helpful direction for parenting and relationships within the church!

Lastly in our Gospel reading Mary and Joseph were charged with keeping Jesus safe until he could fulfil his destiny as Saviour of the World. Let us thank God for human love and our protective instinct, for those who have loved and protected us.

# Reading Exodus 2.1-10

Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. The daughter of Pharaoh came down to



bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be

one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

#### **Psalm** *Psalm* 34.11-20

Come, O children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. Which of you desires life, and covets many days to enjoy good? Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from speaking deceit. Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.

The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their cry. The face of the Lord is against evildoers, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth. When the righteous cry for help, the Lord hears, and rescues them from all their troubles. The Lord is near to the broken-hearted, and saves the crushed in spirit.

Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord rescues them from them all. He keeps all their bones; not one of them will be broken.



# Reading Colossians 3.12-17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must



forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ

rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

# Gospel Luke 2.33-35

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him.



Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that

the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

Loving God, as a mother feeds her children at the breast you feed us in this sacrament with the food and drink of eternal life: help us who have tasted your goodness to grow in grace within the household of faith; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
