In Leviticus, Jubilee is a special
celebration for the whole community:
'You shall hallow the fiftieth year and you
shall proclaim liberty throughout the land
to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee
for you: you shall return, every one of
you, to your property and every one of
you to your family. That fiftieth year shall
be a jubilee for you...' Shavuot, fifty days
after Passover (the Greek giving us
'Pentecost'), draws the pilgrims in
thanksgiving for the harvest, for God's
guidance and Law. It is also a joyful
celebration for the whole community.
This year, Shavuot, the Jewish Feast of
Weeks, coincides with the Christian
Feast of Pentecost. A special celebration
for the whole community is the intention
for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee. With
beacons lit around the world and people
in many countries taking part, not just
the 54 members of the Commonwealth,
the size of the 'whole community'
enjoying the celebrations is truly global.
At the centre of it, a person whose quiet
witness speaks clearly amid the
surrounding noise, one who believes,
trusts and serves the Gospel; a calling in
which we all share. On this feast of the
'birthday' of the Church, let us celebrate
the gifts God gives us and rejoice with
thanksgiving in this special Jubilee year.

'Thy choicest gifts in store
On her be pleased to pour,

Reading Acts 2.1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as



of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All

of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs - in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: "In the

last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Psalms Psalm 104.26-36,37b

There go the ships, and Leviathan that you formed to sport in it.

These all look to you to give them their food in due season; when you give to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things. When you hide your face, they are dismayed; when you take away their breath, they die and return to their dust. 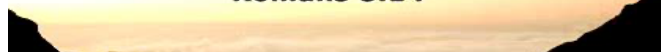


Reading Romans 8.14-17

Gospel *John 14.8-17*

Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.' Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it. 'If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be



with you for ever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees

him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.
