Every year, the readings for the Sunday
before Lent include the Gospel passage
about the transfiguration of Jesus. The
Armenians keep the Feast of the
Transfiguration of our Lord on the
fourteenth Sunday after Easter. So why
is 6 August the date kept by most other
Christians? Feast days are sometimes
given their day to commemorate a
special event, such as the dedication of
a basilica in Rome. This date was
ordered by Pope Callixtus III (31
December 1378–6 August 1458) to
celebrate victory over the Turks,
following the siege of Belgrade in 1456.
I wonder what feast day the
Archbishop of Canterbury might wish
to introduce to celebrate a significant
English football victory...?

His disciples seeing the appearance of
Jesus change in a dramatic way 'his
clothes became dazzling white' is
recorded in Matthew (17.1-8), Mark
(9.2-8) and Luke (9.28-36); referred to
in 2 Peter (1.16-19) and hinted at in
John 1.14. It speaks to us of glory
revealed, the Resurrection of Jesus
anticipated, the inner light of God
shining forth, seeing Jesus as he really is
and, for the disciples, hearing
confirmation of it: 'This is my Son, my
Chosen, listen to him!' The Christian
pilgrimage to heaven begins at baptism
and is energised by such an encounter.
In the Eucharist, we pray 'form us into
the likeness of Christ'. May our
encounter with the living Lord
transform, transfigure our lives that we
may indeed come to resemble him.

Father in heaven, whose Son Jesus Christ was wonderfully transfigured before chosen witnesses upon the holy mountain, and spoke of the exodus he would accomplish at Jerusalem: give us strength so to hear his voice and bear our cross that in the world to come we may see him as he is; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Reading *Daniel 7.9-10,13-14*

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames,



and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousand served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood

attending him. The court sat in judgement, and the books were opened.

As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

Psalm *Psalm 97*

The Lord is king! Let the earth rejoice; let the many coastlands be glad! Clouds and thick darkness are all around him; righteousness and justice are the foundation



of his throne. Fire goes before him, and consumes his adversaries on every side. His lightnings light up the world; the earth sees and trembles. The mountains melt like wax

before the Lord, before the Lord of all the earth.

The heavens proclaim his righteousness; and all the peoples behold his glory. All worshippers of images are put to shame, those who make their boast in worthless idols; all gods bow down before him. Zion hears and is glad, and the towns of Judah rejoice, because of your judgements, O God. For you, O Lord, are most high over all the earth; you are exalted far above all gods. The Lord loves those who hate evil; he guards the lives of his faithful; he rescues them from the hand of the wicked. Light dawns for the righteous, and joy for the upright in heart. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous, and give thanks to his holy name!

Reading *2 Peter 1.16-19*

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he

received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the

Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.' We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

Gospel *Luke 9.28-36*

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his

departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since



they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

Holy God, we see your glory in the face of Jesus Christ: may we who are partakers at his table reflect his life in word and deed, that all the world may know his power to change and save. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Repairs included re-shingling the spire, repointing and repairs to the stonework of the tower, repairs and re-gilding of the weathercock.
