If we start with Christmas Day, and count 8 days, we come to today, I January. It was the eighth day after his birth that Jesus was circumcised and received his name. It's today that the Church celebrates the Holy Name of Jesus,

The name of Jesus points us to who He is and who He is for us: the Saviour. Jesus is the one who delivers us; rescues us; leads us into a new and different way of life.

Sadly, the name of Jesus is, all too often, nowadays, used as a swear word. I hate this. The truth is that, for the Christian and whatever your circumstances, the Holy Name of Jesus can be your prayer. You will find in his name enough love, enough courage and joy to last you a lifetime, whatever may come your way!

In this New Year some of us may experience wonderful joys, new opportunities, unique blessings. We can express our gratitude, using the name of Jesus. Some of us may face great challenges of one kind or another, personal, financial, whatever, during these troubled times. We can meet them confidently, praying to God, and using the name of Jesus. Perhaps some of us will die during the coming year. We can leave this life at peace with God, with the name of Jesus on our lips. (I remember the death of a former parishioner in hospital doing just that!)

May 2023 be for each of us a year when we work for, and discover that, this world can become a very different place through the power of the Holy Name of Jesus.

his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to

you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.

So they shall put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them.

heavens. Out of the mouths of babes and infants you have founded a bulwark because of your foes, to silence the enemy and the avenger.

Yet you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honour. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas.

Reading Galatians 4.4-7

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' So you



are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

Gospel Luke 2.15-21 When the angels had left

them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

After eight days had passed, it was time to

circumcise the child; and he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.




New Boiler for St Nicholas' January 2023
