Today's reading is about the Transfiguration, when lesus, accompanied by his closest companions, goes to the mountaintop and is transformed. Before their eyes, he changes from an unassuming man in his normal clothes to a being emanating intense white light. Not only that, but God says 'This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!' From this point on, the Disciples can no longer regard Jesus in the same way. His divinity has been revealed. This revelation, which comes just after He told them that He would be put to death in Jerusalem, is to help them through the difficulties ahead.

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday; a time when we enter into Lent and begin to prepare ourselves for Easter. We are fortunate in that we already know the ending. We know that even though Jesus is put to death, he will rise again. The disciples were in a different position. They didn't have a full understanding of what was about to happen.

The Transfiguration gave them reassurance. It gave them a glimpse of something divine with Jesus. We too need reassurance in our lives. Our reassurance comes from knowing lesus in all His glory. It's the reassurance that we are known and loved by God. It's the reassurance that throughout all the difficulties, trials and tribulations of life, lesus is with us. Always.

Reading Exodus 24.12-18

The Lord said to Moses, 'Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.' So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, 'Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them.' Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of



the Lord settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the

cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

Psalm Psalm 2

Why do the nations conspire, and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and his anointed, saying, 'Let us burst their bonds asunder, and cast their cords from us.'

He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord has them in derision. Then he will speak to them in his wrath, and terrify them in his fury, saying, 'I have set my king on Zion, my holy hill.'

I will tell of the decree of the Lord: He said to me, 'You are my son; today I have begotten you. Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage, and the ends of the earth your possession. You shall break them with a rod of iron, and dash them in pieces

like a potter's vessel.'
Now therefore, O
kings, be wise; be
warned, O rulers of
the earth. Serve the
Lord with fear, with
trembling kiss his feet,



or he will be angry, and you will perish in the way; for his wrath is quickly kindled.

Reading 2 Peter 1.16-21

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.' We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand




this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came

by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

Gospel Matthew 17.1-9

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' While he was still speaking, suddenly a

bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the



Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!' When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.' And when

they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'


