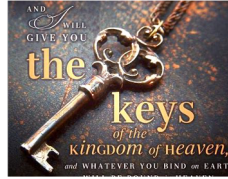

One of the exceptionally lovely places in the Holy Land is Caesarea Phillipi, set just below Mount Hermon, the highest mountain in the area. It is located several miles north of the Sea of Galilee, in the territory then ruled by Philip, who rebuilt and renamed the city after the emperor Caesar and himself. The influence of Greek and Roman culture, and pagan temples and idols was everywhere; it was here that Jesus challenged the apostles with the simple question: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?"

The disciples came up with four answers: John the Baptist, who had been killed by Herod Antipas – although some people thought he was alive again; Elijah, whom some Jews thought would return to earth to welcome the Messiah; Jeremiah, a 'senior' Old Testament Prophet - or just one of the other prophets.

Peter, often the spokesman for the disciples, but here speaking for himself, answered: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Despite spending so much time with Jesus, listening to his teaching, and witnessing his miracles, Jesus says it is God who led Peter to understand who he is, and goes on to appoint him to lead his Church. Like the first rock in God's building, it is Peter who spoke out on the day of Pentecost. He preached, and over 3000 converts were made on that day. (Would that this would happen today in our own country!)

So, the question and the challenge for us is quite simply: Who do we say that Jesus is? Will our answers be wishy-washy, or will they be spontaneous like Peter's, declaring Christ to be the Son of God?

Reading *Isaiah 51.1-6*

Listen to me, you that pursue righteousness, you that seek the Lord. Look to the rock



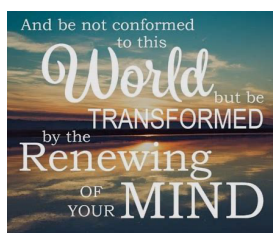
from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug. Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; for he was but one when I called him, but I blessed him and made

him many. For the Lord will comfort Zion; he will comfort all her waste places, and will make her wilderness like Eden, her desert like the garden of the Lord; joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song.

Listen to me, my people, and give heed to me, my nation; for a teaching will go out from me, and my justice for a light to the peoples. I will bring near my deliverance swiftly, my salvation has gone out and my arms will rule the peoples; the coastlands wait for me, and for my arm they hope. Lift up your eyes to the heavens, and look at the earth beneath; for the heavens will vanish like smoke, the earth will wear out like a garment, and those who live on it will die like gnats; but my salvation will be for ever, and my deliverance will never be ended.

Reading *Romans 12.1-8*

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is

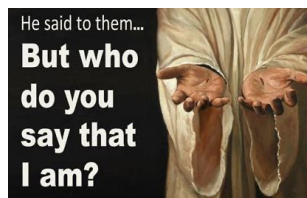


the will of God - what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

Gospel *Matthew 16.13-20*

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one



of the prophets.' He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah,

the Son of the living God.' And Jesus answered him, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.' Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

God of all mercy, in this eucharist you have set aside our sins and given us your healing: grant that we who are made whole in Christ may bring that healing to this broken world, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

A Service of Thanksgiving for the life of Stuart will be held at St Nicholas' Church on Wednesday 6 September at 14:00. You are invited to wear something blue.

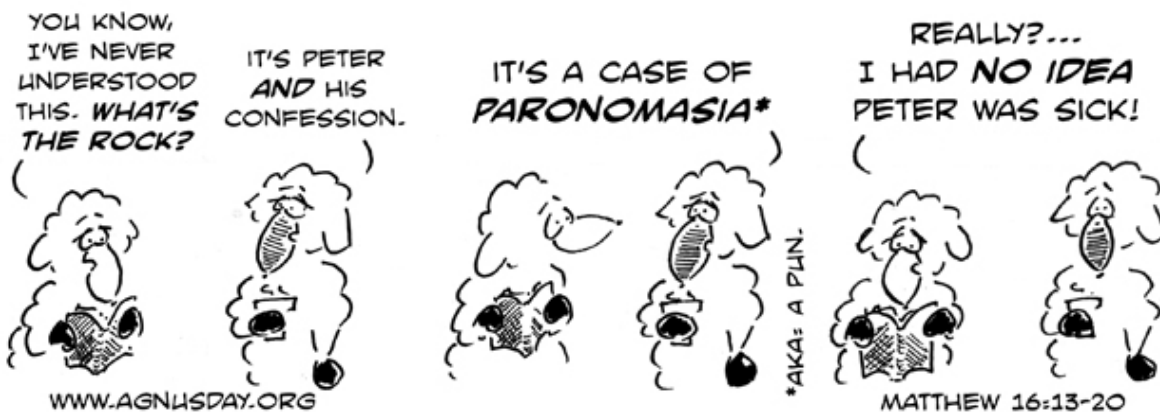
Alastair and Rose
