The general thinking which had been shared by the apostles, was that Jesus would come as a conquering king Messiah. However, by contrast, Jesus came as a suffering servant. In today's Gospel passage (also from Matthew) Jesus spells out what would happen to him: He will go to Jerusalem; he will suffer many things from the religious leaders, and then be killed. But, Jesus adds, he will rise again on the third day.

Needless to say, the apostles are appalled. "Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, Oh no, Lord! This will never happen to you!" Whereupon Jesus slaps Peter down! What the apostles didn't – perhaps couldn't - understand was that it was the will of God that Jesus would suffer and die.

Many of us have no idea what it really means to follow Jesus, partly because we don't understand what we need to do. Some of us aren't willing to give time to follow him. Some of us aren't willing to give up bad habits, or our own pride to follow Jesus. Some of us aren't willing to stop hating people who are different to ourselves; some of us aren't willing to love our neighbours-inneed in order to follow Jesus. But what Jesus wants of us, as he points out throughout the Gospels, is real sacrifice — to take up our own cross and follow Him.

Almighty God, you search us and know us: may we rely on you in strength and rest on you in weakness, now and in all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Reading Jeremiah 15.15-21

O Lord, you know; remember me and visit me, and bring down retribution for me on my persecutors. In your forbearance do not take me away; know that on your account I suffer insult. Your words were found, and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart; for I am called by your name, O Lord, God of hosts. I did not sit in the company of merrymakers, nor did I rejoice; under the weight of your hand I sat alone, for you had filled me with indignation. Why is my pain unceasing, my wound incurable, refusing to be healed? Truly, you are to me like a deceitful brook, like waters that fail.

Therefore, thus says the Lord: If you turn back, I will take you back, and you shall stand before me. If you utter what is precious, and not what is worthless, you shall serve as my mouth. It is they who will turn to you, not you who will turn to them. And I will make you to this people a fortified wall of bronze;

they will fight against you, but they shall not prevail **OVER YOU,** for I am with you to save you and deliver you, declares the Lord.

Reading Romans 12.9-21

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be


patient in suffering, persevere in prayer.
Contribute to the needs of



the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.' No, 'if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Gospel Matthew 16.21-28

From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, 'God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling-block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'



Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and

take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find

it. For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life? 'For the Son of Man is to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay everyone for what has been done. Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom.'
