The shepherds, summoned by an angel, have visited the baby in the manger. They return home, praising God for what they have seen and heard. Then comes the focus of celebration. "When eight days were fulfilled for the circumcision of the child," we hear from the gospel, "he was given the name of Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived."

The name that Jesus receives is heavy with significance. It is the same as that of Joshua, the Old Testament hero who leads Israel into the land of freedom. The name means literally "The Lord is salvation." This is the name that Gabriel, at the Annunciation, told Mary to name her child. It is a name that comes from God. The name of the Saviour, Jesus himself, the salvation he brings, all come from God.

Sadly, all too many people nowadays use the name as an expletive, even as a swear word.... As Christians, as believers in the Christ child, we must never do that! Whatever your circumstances, the Holy Name of Jesus can be your prayer. You will find in this great name enough courage and joy to last you a lifetime, whatever may come your way in the future. I have actually been at the bedside of a person dying in hospital using the name of Jesus, followed by 'Dear Lord'.

A new year lies before us; and we don't know what it will bring. Whatever your personal circumstances, may 2024 be for each of us a year when we pray our Saviour's name with faith and a year when we discover that this world can become a very different place through the power of lesus.

Reading *Isaiah* 61.10-62.3

I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole



being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself

with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

Reading Galatians 4.4-7

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son

into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.



Gospel Luke 2.15-21

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. After eight days had passed, it was time to



circumcise the child; and he was called Jesus, the

name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.
