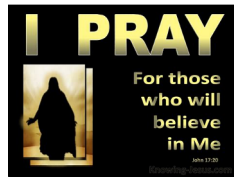

Today's Gospel reading comes from the prayer Christ used on the night of his betrayal, either in the Garden of Gethsemane or in the Upper Room at the Last Supper. It deals with the relationship between Christ, his disciples and all believers of the future – and that includes us! We are held in the mind of Christ! It is clear that Christ intended its messages to be recalled by his disciples in their own ministry after he had left them. It is an abstraction from a situation that is a hallmark of St John's Gospel.

I find it strange that the Lectionary compilers stopped this reading short at verse 19 because verse 20 is such an overwhelming summary of what Christ has said in this prayer.

I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be as one.

The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one.

How is Christ's glory revealed? It is, in fact through his humility, through his engagement with human distress and corruption, through his suffering, through his death and sacrifice. For us it means that we engage ourselves with the imperfections of the world, the seemingly inexplicable tragedies, the animosities of difference, rather than living in a world insulated and protected from the outrages that dominate the lives of so many, in order to bring the radiant light of Christ to bear on the world. That is a most powerful message for us all. Chapter 17 of St John's Gospel is Christ's gift to us all. Please read and re-read it.

Collect

Risen, ascended Lord, as we rejoice at your triumph, fill your Church on earth with power and compassion, that all who are estranged by sin may find forgiveness and know your peace, to the glory of God the Father. **Amen**

Reading Acts 1.15-17,21-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus - for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.'

So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us - one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these



two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on

Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

Reading 1 John 5.9-13

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his

Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

Gospel John 17.6-19

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son.
