**Do you believe in angels?** This is a question that probably ranks with questions like 'Do you believe in fairies?' and 'do you believe in aliens?' The Bible is quite clear about their existence - angels that is! They appear in both Old and New Testaments hundreds of times. Interestingly nowadays, partly because young people are searching for 'something' and not necessarily organized religion, there has been a resurgence in belief in angels.

The truth is that angels are part of creation and have a special role. They are part of a hierarchy which includes differing orders of angels: cherubim, seraphim, archangels and so on – headed up by St Michael, the Archangel. In the Bible, as messengers, for example to Abraham and to Mary, they reveal God's will. As Guardian Angels they guide and protect us, provided we are open to them.

I personally believe in angels' existence. After all, the ministry of Jesus was surrounded by angels: they announced his birth, they ministered to him after his temptation; Jesus said he could call on twelve legions of angels to defend him when he was arrested (Matt. 26:53); they announced his Resurrection and were there after Jesus' Ascension.

Quite a lot of people today, my Dad included, speak of experiences of angels; we would perhaps be wise not to dismiss them but, rather, to look for the hand of God at work in unexpected places and in unexpected ways.

There is an old American folk saying that when babies smile in their sleep, they are listening to the voices of angels. May that be the same for you and for me!

## Reading *Genesis 28.10-17*

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went towards Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place.



And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were

ascending and descending on it. And the Lord stood beside him and said, 'I am the Lord, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring; and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you.' Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, 'Surely the Lord is in this place - and I did not know it!' And he was afraid, and said, 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.'

## Reading *Hebrews 1.5-14*

For to which of the angels did God ever say, 'You are my Son; today I have begotten you'? Or again, 'I will be his Father, and he will be my Son'? And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, 'Let all

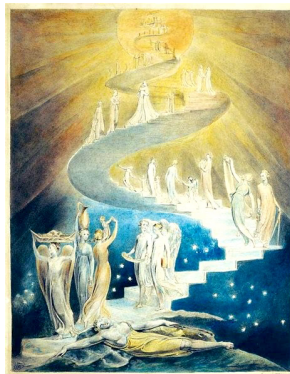
God's angels worship him.' Of the angels he says, 'He makes his angels winds, and his servants flames of fire.' But of the Son he says, 'Your throne, O God, is for ever and ever, and the righteous sceptre is the sceptre of your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated lawlessness; therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond

**Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; Therefore God, thy God, hath anointed thee With the oil of gladness above thy fellows.**

your companions.' And, 'In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands; they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like clothing; like a cloak you will roll them up, and like clothing they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will never end.' But to which of the angels has he ever said, 'Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet'? Are not all angels spirits in the divine service, sent to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation?

## Gospel *John 1.47-51*

When Jesus saw Nathanael coming towards him, he said of him, 'Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!' Nathanael asked him, 'Where did you come to know me?' Jesus answered, 'I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you.' Nathanael replied, 'Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the



King of Israel!' Jesus answered, 'Do you believe because And he said to him, 'Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.'

### Michael and All Angels.

We are celebrating the Archangel Michael and All Angels.

Angels have long been a source of inspiration for artwork and they continue to be a source of inspiration. Anyone who has travelled to Newcastle will have surely seen the modern sculpture The Angel of the North by Antony Gormley. I gather it is one of the most viewed pieces of art. It is very much part of Gateshead's identity. With its prime location on a hilltop by the A1, it stands like a guardian angel. Love it or hate it, its presence cannot be ignored.

Another very notable piece of sculpture that I saw in the grounds of Rochester Cathedral in 2019, is 'The Knife Angel'. It has toured the country, so you may well have seen it. This sculpture is so pertinent in the present time when there is so much concern about knife crime. Like The Angel of the North, it has a commanding presence. The sculptor, Alfie Bradley, put out a call for knives from a knife amnesty and made them into an angel.

There is something compelling about this statue. Perhaps it is the way the head is inclined or perhaps it is in the way the hands reach out. Despite the fact that it is made of weapons, the nature of an angelic presence is clearly evident. It takes implements of violence and transforms them into a thing of beauty. It is reminiscent of the verse from Isaiah Chapter 2 'They shall beat their swords into ploughshares.'

I think it is so encouraging that angels continue to inspire and direct. They certainly continue to have the power to move and to influence.
