There are many observations to be drawn from today's Gospel reading.

After Jesus has used Simon Peter's boat as a preaching station because of the crowds on the lake shore, there is Simon's reluctance to put out into the lake again after a night's totally unrewarding fishing. There is also the hint that Simon thinks that his experience as a fishermen should not be set aside by this carpenter, Jesus. Nevertheless, he accepts the authority of Jesus and the boats sail to a deeper part of the lake where vast volumes of fish are caught.

Jesus sometimes asks us to behave in counter-intuitive ways which seem to make no sense to us at the time. Then a revelation of the reason may come to us and be overwhelming as happened to Simon Peter. With the benefit of hindsight, we know that Simon Peter was gradually being prepared for his role in establishing God's Church after the earthly ministry of Jesus had ended. Such was the force of the revelation of the power of lesus that the fishermen left their fishing and became his disciples. We're not told the details of whether they continued at all with their fishing and what happened to their boats and their nets – essential tools of the trade. What we do know, however, is that through the power of Jesus a traditional way of life was abandoned and the disciples' journey with Jesus began. It doesn't usually require us to abandon our occupations and earthly relationships in order to follow lesus, but it does require us to give him space in our lives and, at times, to nudge us in directions we weren't expecting to go. Are we prepared for this?



Reading Isaiah 6.1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' Then I heard the



voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will

go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

Reading | | Corinthians | 15.1-11

Now I should remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to

you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through

which also you are being saved, if you hold

firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you - unless you have come to believe in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to someone untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace towards me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them - though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

Gospel Luke 5.1-11

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.'

When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break.



So they signalled to their partners in the

other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!' For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.' When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

Go before us, Lord, in all we do with your most gracious favour, and guide us with your continual help that in all our works begun, continued and ended in you we may glorify your holy name, and finally by your mercy receive everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

meets on **Mon 10 February** at **14:00** in St Barnabas'. Old and new friends very welcome


Toddlers Group meets on Tues 13:00-15:00 and Thurs 9:00-11:00, in St Barnabas' Hall.
