Today we celebrate the Feast of St Matthew. We know that he was a Jewish tax collector. Indeed, known also as Levi, he was busy at his work dealing with taxes in Capernaum when Jesus called him with a simple "Follow me." And this he did, leaving his books and ledgers - to become one of the Twelve Apostles, a Gospel writer and an Evangelist.

Matthew's Gospel is unique in providing us with Jesus' family tree from Abraham, through the generations, right down to his mother Mary and his birth. Indeed, his Gospel forms the connecting link between the Old and the New Testaments because of the emphasis on the fulfilment of the Old Testament prophecies. Because of his closeness to lesus, he gives us insight as to who lesus was - especially to his lewish readers, some of whom feared an upheaval because of Jesus' teachings. He challenged them quoting Jesus: "Do not think I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets. I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them." (5.17)

The main purpose of Matthew's Gospel account was to present to his generation, and indeed to us, the clear evidence that Jesus is the Messiah, the Saviour.

May we be inspired by Matthew's story of his transformation from a despised tax collector to Apostle and Gospel writer and to serve as a reminder to each one of us that God's call can come to us when we least expect it.

Reading Proverbs 3.13-18




Happy are those who find wisdom. and those who get

Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honour. Her ways are ways of pleasantness, and all her paths are peace. She is a tree of life to those who lay hold of her; those who hold her fast are called happy.

2 Corinthians 4.1-6 Reading

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practise cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them

from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus



Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Matthew 9.9-13 Gospel



As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called **Matthew** sitting at the

tax booth; and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him.

And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax-collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, 'Why does your teacher eat with taxcollectors and sinners?' But when he heard this, he said, 'Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.'


