Today's Gospel passage (Luke.21vv.5-19) contains some hard lessons. Whilst Jesus' disciples admire the beauty of the Temple, Jesus shockingly declares that 'the day will come when not one stone will be left on another'. He adds that there will be wars, earthquakes, famines and plagues. But why does Jesus say all this?

Essentially Jesus wants to shift the disciples' focus from the temporary to the eternal. Even the most magnificent works of this world will pass away, so our hope cannot rest in buildings, or even on earthly stability. All of these are temporary. Our focus must be on God!

Through the darkness of our Gospel reading two promises shine through: Firstly, Jesus promises his presence; when everything feels uncertain His spirit equips us to speak the truth and to stand firm. "I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to resist or contradict". Secondly, Jesus promises ultimate safety in him. "Not a hair of your head will perish. By standing firm you will win true life for yourselves."

Jesus, in this and at other times, does NOT say that we won't face pain or loss in this life – but that we are secure in his hands. Our faith and endurance, even when the going gets tough, is how we demonstrate our trust in eternal values.

So, when our world feels unstable (as it does now!); when news, relationships, sickness or other personal troubles shake us, Jesus calls us to look up, not around. The things of this world are temporary and will crumble, whereas God's promises stand for ever.

So, take heart, dear hearts!

# **Reading** 2 Thessalonians 3.6-13


Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their

own living.
Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.



# Gospel Luke 21.5-19

When some were speaking about the temple,



how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon

another; all So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.


