Here we are in the days between
Christmas and the New Year. At this time
betwixt Christmas and the New Year, we
have a moment in time when we can
reflect and give thanks for the miracle of
the coming of Jesus, God Incarnate.

For many, Christ remains the perpetual
babe in a manger, but the narrative moves
on. We hear of the jealous King Herod
who would go to any lengths to try to
preserve his supremacy. He used his
power and influence to terrorise and
destroy, just as so many dictators have
done throughout the ages, but as we
discover, his power wasn't enough to
thwart God's redemptive plan.

Joseph was warned by an angel to take
Mary and Jesus and flee to a land where
they would be strangers, but it was a land
that would provide a place of safety for
them. What thoughts and feelings do
those images evoke in you?

Life can be scary at times, as it must have
been for that little family as they made
haste to escape the clutches of Herod.
We may never be in that situation, but we
face other circumstances that frighten or
unsettle us. However, we are not alone
because God is with us.

As we approach the New Year,
remember:

'The Lord Himself goes before you and
will be with you, he will never leave you,
nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not
be dismayed.' Deuteronomy 31:8.

May you know God's love and peace in
the year that is to come.

Reading *Jeremiah 31.15-17*

Thus says the Lord: A voice is heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping. Rachel is weeping for her children; she refuses to be comforted for her children, because they are no more. Thus says the Lord: Keep your voice from weeping, and your eyes from tears, for there is a reward for your work, says the Lord: they shall come back from the land of

Reading *1 Corinthians 1.26-29*

But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God.

Gospel *Matthew 2.12-18*

Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to

Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.' Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of Egypt I have called my son.'

When Herod saw that he had been tricked by



the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had

learned from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah: 'A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they are no more.'

Once set up, Gift Aid is collected automatically by the Parish Giving Scheme and you won't need to do anything else (just remember to cancel your standing order to the church account).

If you'd prefer to keep giving as you do now, that's absolutely fine, but if you are a tax payer we'll need a Gift Aid form to be completed. If you have already completed one that will be sufficient but if you haven't or are not sure whether you have or not then please complete one. A copy of the form will be available at both churches.

Please do consider moving your giving to the Parish Giving Scheme as it will guarantee that the church gets maximum benefit from your financial support and reduce the amount of parish admin.
